- Parents may not remain in the studios for the duration of the camp session.
- Before-Care starts at 8:30am

Parents Picking-Up

- Please come into the building to pick up your camper.
- After-Care parents need to sign out their camper each day. Please do not be late.
- Children under 11 years old are not allowed to leave Craft Alliance without a parent.

Confirmation Policy

You will receive confirmation of enrollment and Summer Camp information via email from the Craft Alliance Registrar. Return all required documents prior to the start.

Studio and Classroom Safety

Craft Alliance Summer camps are fun and active. ONLY CLOSE-TOED SHOES ALLOWED. All long hair should be tied back. Campers please dress for fun arts experiences, consider an apron or old shirt.

Ages 10-14 and Teens please bring a long-sleeve cotton shirt and pants for working in the Glass or Metals Studio.

Craft Alliance is equipped with first aid stations and has trained first-responders on-site.

When you combine two half-day camps as a full-day, receive supervised lunchtime! Please pack a lunch, a snack, and a drink for your camper's full day.

Cancellation Policy

Craft Alliance reserves the right to cancel, combine, or reschedule workshops/classes/camps to adjust for enrollment. If Craft Alliance cancels a workshop/class/camp, you may transfer to another workshop/class/camp or receive a full refund.

Withdrawal and Refund Policy

A \$25 withdrawal fee will be charged per workshop/class/camp. Notice of withdrawal must be made in writing and received at least 14 days prior to the start of a workshop/class/camp. No refunds will be given for withdrawals made after that time. Non-attendance to class, telephone or other verbal communication is not considered an official notice of withdrawal. No refunds or credits for classes missed due to illness, personal conflict, or other reasons. The schedules do not allow for students to make up missed classes.
