In conjunction with Summer Camps, Craft Alliance offers a Teen Internship. Teen Interns can apply to assist our summer camp faculty in the studio of their interest! In exchange for volunteering, Teen Interns can enroll in one or two of the 5 Teen Studio sessions offered. Craft Alliance Summer Camp Faculty and Teen Interns work together to create a safe and exciting studio environment where youth are supervised and engaged in learning. All faculty have passed federal and state background checks.

Ages 10-14 and Teens please bring a long-sleeve cotton shirt and pants for working in the Glass or Metals Studio.

Craft Alliance is equipped with first aid stations and has trained first-responders on-site.

Campers should not bring toys or non-essential personal items to camp. Craft Alliance cannot be held responsible for lost or stolen personal items.

Only currently enrolled students may attend classes or camps. Parents are welcome to visit but may not attend children's camps or classes.

Cancellation Policy

Craft Alliance reserves the right to cancel, combine, or reschedule workshops/ classes/camps to adjust for enrollment. If Craft Alliance cancels a workshop/ class/camp, you may transfer to another workshop/class/camp or receive a full refund.

Withdrawal and Refund Policy

A \$25 withdrawal fee will be charged per camp. Notice of withdrawal must be made in writing and received at least 14 days prior to the start of a camp. No refunds will be given for withdrawals made after that time. Non-attendance to camp, telephone or other verbal communication is not considered an official notice of withdrawal. No refunds or credits for classes missed due to illness, personal conflict, or other reasons. The schedules do not allow for students to make up missed classes.

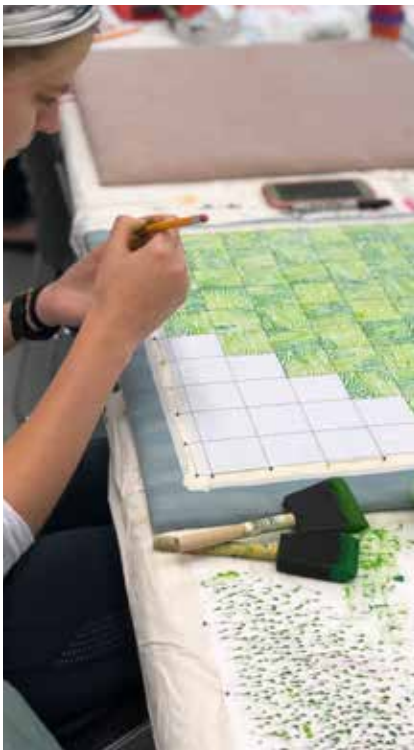
